## **Executive summary**

1. The Independent Parliamentary Expenses Authority (IPEA) conducted an Assurance Review of travel and travel-related expenses incurred by Senator Ross Cadell and MOP(S) Act Staff in his office during the period 1 April to 30 June 2023. The Assurance Review forms part of IPEA's 3 Year Assurance Plan.

#### Assurance Review Findings

- 2. The Assurance Review assessed whether the use of parliamentary business resources by Senator Cadell was for the dominant purpose of parliamentary business. IPEA identified Senator Cadell as having used parliamentary business resources for travel to:
  - a. Bathurst between 8 and 10 April 2023
  - b. Tamworth between 16 and 18 April 2023
  - c. The Gold Coast between 18 and 19 April 2023
  - d. Darwin between 26 and 30 June 2023
- 3. The Assurance Review also assessed whether the use of public resources by two of Senator Cadell's staff for unaccompanied travel to:
  - a. Melbourne between 23 and 24 April 2023
  - b. Brisbane and return on 8 May 2023

was in accordance with the legislative framework.

4. Having considered the available information, including the detailed response provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied that his travel to Bathurst, the Gold Coast and Darwin was for the dominant purpose of parliamentary business and was consistent with the legislative framework. IPEA is also satisfied the staff travel was directed by Senator Cadell for official duties and was in accordance with the legislative framework.

## Scope and Purpose

5. The scope of this Assurance Review is travel and travel-related expenses incurred by Senator Cadell and two MOP(S) Act staff during the period 1 April to 30 June 2023. The purpose of the Assurance Review was to determine whether the use of public resources was consistent with the legislative framework.

#### **Engagement with Senator Cadell**

- 6. On 22 November 2023, IPEA wrote to Senator Cadell in relation to travel expenses incurred by him and two of his MOP(S) Act staff during the period in scope. In relation to his travel, Senator Cadell was asked to confirm the dominant purpose of his travel to Bathurst, the Gold Coast and Darwin. Senator Cadell was also asked to provide details of the nature of his parliamentary business in Bathurst, the Gold Coast and Darwin and provide copies of documentation in support of his claim.
- 7. IPEA noted Senator Cadell's travel to Tamworth to attend the NSW Nationals State Conference fell within the period in scope of this Assurance Review. IPEA is satisfied this travel was for the dominant purpose of parliamentary business and was in accordance with the legislative framework.

- 8. In relation to the unaccompanied staff travel, Senator Cadell was asked to confirm the travel undertaken by the MOP(S) Act staff was authorised by the Senator or an authorised person in his office. Senator Cadell was also asked to advise the official business which required the MOP(S) staff to travel to Melbourne and Brisbane unaccompanied.
- 9. As no response had been received, on 8 January 2024, IPEA again wrote to Senator Cadell seeking a response by 23 January 2024. Senator Cadell was advised that IPEA may consider other options to progress the review if a response was not received. On 10 January 2024, Senator Cadell sought an extension of time to provide a response. An extension was granted to the first week in February.
- 10. Senator Cadell provided a comprehensive response on 6 February 2024, confirming the dominant purpose of his travel to Bathurst, the Gold Coast and Darwin was for parliamentary business. Senator Cadell also confirmed the unaccompanied staff travel was undertaken as directed by him for the purpose of representing the Senator at various meetings.

## Audit and Assurance function

#### IPEA's statutory audit function

- 11. IPEA audits parliamentarians' work expenses and the travel expenses of their staff under section 12 of the *Independent Parliamentary Expenses Authority Act 2017* (IPEA Act). IPEA conducts Assurance Reviews to assess the use of parliamentary business resources against the legislative framework to determine if there has been misuse.
- 12. Potential outcomes of an Assurance Review include:
  - a. no further action in circumstances where the review has concluded the use of parliamentary business resources was not inconsistent with the legislative framework, or
  - b. administrative remedial action, including penalty where the review has concluded there is evidence the use of parliamentary business resources was not consistent with the legislative framework, or
  - c. an IPEA initiated Ruling or Audit, where there is evidence of systemic or substantial misuse of parliamentary business resources, or
  - d. referral to the Australian Federal Police where compelling prima facie evidence of fraud or other criminal conduct is identified.

## Legislative framework

- 13. The legislation relevant to this Assurance Review is:
  - a. Parliamentary Business Resources Act 2017 (PBR Act)
  - b. Parliamentary Business Resource Regulations 2017 (the Regulations)
  - c. Parliamentary Business Resources (Parliamentary Business) Determination 2017 (Parliamentary Business Determination)
  - d. Parliamentary Business Resources (Commonwealth Transport) Determination 2017 (Commonwealth Transport Determination)
  - e. Members of Parliament (Staff) Act 1984 (MOP(S) Act)
  - f. MOP(S) Act Determination 2020/15 Staff Travel and Relief Staff Arrangements (now Determination 2023/10) (Staff Travel Determination)
  - g. Commonwealth Members of Parliament Staff Enterprise Agreement 2020-23
  - h. Ministerial and Parliamentary Services Domestic Travel Guideline
- 14. The PBR Act and the Regulations established a framework for providing resources to parliamentarians in respect of their parliamentary business. Parliamentarians are eligible to claim public resources under the framework in respect of their parliamentary business.

- 15. Section 6 of the PBR Act provides the meaning of *parliamentary business*:
  - (1) The *parliamentary business* of a member means any of the following:
    - (a) the *parliamentary duties* of a member, being activities of the member that:
      - (i) relate directly to the member's role as a member; and
      - (ii) are determined for the purposes of paragraph (4)(a);
    - (b) the *electorate duties* of the member, being activities of the member that:
      - (i) support or serve the member's constituents; and
      - (ii) are determined for the purposes of paragraph (4)(b);
    - (c) the *party political duties* of the member, being activities determined for the purposes of paragraph (4)(c);
    - (d) for a member who is an office holder or a Minister of State—the *official duties* of the member being activities that:
      - (i) relate to the member's role as an office holder or Minister of State; and
      - (ii) are determined for the purposes of paragraph (4)(d).
- 16. Subsection 6(4) of the PBR Act provides the Minister must determine activities of a member that are *parliamentary duties* of the member, or *electorate duties* of the member, or *party political duties* of the member, or *official duties* of the member. The Parliamentary Business Determination prescribes the activities which fall within the four duty streams set out in section 6 of the PBR Act.
- 17. Subsection 6(2) of the PBR Act further provides in part:

However, an activity is not the *parliamentary business* of a member if:

- (a) the member carries it out for the dominant purpose of either or both the following:
  - (i) providing a personal benefit to the member or another person;
  - (ii) pursuing commercial purposes of the member or another person; ...
- 18. Subsection 9(1) of the PBR Act details expenses that may be incurred for travel:

For the purposes of this Act, the following are examples of expenses incurred in connection with travel:

- (a) the cost of fares;
- (b) the cost of taxis and other local transport in connection with travel;
- (c) the costs of the provision of charter services;
- (d) the cost of accommodation;
- (e) the cost of meals;
- (f) the cost of incidentals.
- 19. The Commonwealth Transport Determination provides that COMCAR services are to be made available for the purposes of subsection 8(2) of the Regulations. There are limits and conditions on member's use of COMCAR within Australia. Subsection 9(1) of the Commonwealth Transport Determination provides:

COMCAR is not available for the purpose of subsection 8(2) of the Regulations if the member could reasonably use the member's private plated vehicle in the circumstances, assuming the member had a private plated vehicle.

Note: A member who chooses an allowance instead of a private plated vehicle could reasonably be expected to use the allowance instead of claiming COMCAR transport costs in circumstances where a private plated vehicle could otherwise reasonably be used.

- 20. As an overarching matter, the public resources prescribed in Parts 2, 3 and 4 of the Regulations are subject to a specific accountability regime established in the PBR Act for that purpose. Parliamentarians' access to and use of public resources are subject to the following obligations:
  - Parliamentarians must be personally responsible and accountable for their use of public resources, and to act ethically and in good faith using and accounting for their use of those resources (see section 25)
  - A parliamentarian must not claim or use public resources unless it is for the dominant purpose of conducting their parliamentary business (dominant purpose test, see section 26)
  - A parliamentarian must ensure value for money for the Commonwealth in incurring expenses or claiming public resources, taking into account the need to conduct the parliamentary business (value for money test, see section 27), and
  - A parliamentarian must not claim resources or incur expenses if any conditions for accessing the resources have not been met (section 28)
- 21. In accordance with sections 30 and 31 of the PBR Act, the Commonwealth must pay the travel expenses and travel allowances as prescribed by the Regulations. Division 1 of Part 2 of the Regulations prescribes travel expenses and travel allowances for travel within Australia for the purposes of sections 30 and 31 of the PBR Act.
- 22. The Staff Travel Determination provides that electorate employees may travel as directed anywhere within Australia on official business. However, item 8 of the Staff Travel Determination states that travel may not be undertaken at Commonwealth expense for the personal benefit of an employee.

## Assurance Review methodology

#### Background

- 23. Review of travel and travel-related expenses by new parliamentarians forms part of IPEA's 3 Year Assurance Plan. On 2 November 2023, in accordance with IPEA's Statutory Audit Function Sheet, IPEA commenced a Preliminary Assessment in relation to the use of travel and travel-related expenses incurred during the period 1 April and 30 June by Senator Cadell, his family members and MOP(S) Act staff employed by the Senator.
- 24. On 3 November 2023, data was obtained from the Audit and Assurance Dashboard for all travel undertaken by Senator Cadell, his family members and MOP(S) Act staff for the period in scope. The Preliminary Assessment found that parliamentary business resources were used by Senator Cadell and two MOP(S) Act Staff during the period in scope.
- 25. On 8 November 2023, IPEA decided to conduct an Assurance Review on travel and travel-related expenses incurred by Senator Cadell and two MOP(S) Act staff.

## Scope of Assurance Review

26. The scope of this Assurance Review is travel and travel-related expenses incurred by Senator Cadell and two MOP(S) Act staff during the period 1 April to 30 June 2023

## Assessment of work expenses

#### Summary of findings

#### **Analysis**

- 27. IPEA considered the legislative framework and applied the following questions:
  - a. What was the dominant purpose for Senator Cadell's travel to:
    - i. Bathurst between 8 and 10 April 2023;
    - ii. The Gold Coast between 18 and 19 May 2023; and
    - iii. Darwin between 26 and 30 June 2023?
  - b. For each trip identified, where the dominant purpose was parliamentary business, what was the nature of Senator Cadell's parliamentary business?
- 28. For the unaccompanied staff travel, the following questions were applied:
  - a. Was the travel directed by Senator Cadell or an authorised person?
  - b. What was the official business which required the MOP(S) Act staff to travel unaccompanied?
- 29. IPEA conducted the Assurance Review by examining and assessing:
  - a. information obtained from the Audit and Assurance Dashboard
  - b. travel bookings and other records held by IPEA in the Parliamentary Expenses Management System
  - c. the relevant legislation and supporting policies
  - d. publicly available information in relation to Senate inquiries and social media for Senator Cadell
  - e. information and documents provided by Senator Cadell

#### Senator Ross Cadell – travel and travel-related expenses

- 30. Senator Cadell travelled from Newcastle to Bathurst by Private Plated Vehicle (PPV) on 8 April 2023, stayed two nights in Bathurst and returned to Newcastle on 10 April 2023. In his response of 6 February 2024, Senator Cadell advised the purpose of his travel to Bathurst was to discuss funding avenues for a proposed multilevel carpark at Bathurst hospital and an extension to the existing racetrack. Senator Cadell confirmed he met with Council staff and stakeholders and presented a trophy at the six-hour event which was held while he was in Bathurst.
- 31. Having considered the available information, including the response provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied the dominant purpose of the travel to Bathurst was parliamentary business and the use of parliamentary business resources was consistent with the legislative framework.
- 32. Senator Cadell travelled from Newcastle to the Gold Coast on 18 May 2023 where he stayed for one night and hired a self-drive car for two days. Senator Cadell used Cabcharge while on the Gold Coast and claimed travel expenses for fuel and parking. Senator Cadell travelled from the Gold Coast to Sydney on 19 May 2023.

- 33. In his response of 6 February 2024, Senator Cadell advised the purpose of his travel to the Gold Coast was for a site visit of a recycling facility relating to the recycling modernisation fund for the Environment and Communications Committee. Senator Cadell confirmed he also met with waste industry consultants gaining an insight into the industry.
- 34. Having regard to the available information, including the response provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied the dominant purpose of his travel to the Gold Coast was parliamentary business and the use of parliamentary business resources was consistent with the legislative framework.
- 35. Senator Cadell travelled from Newcastle to Darwin via Brisbane on 28 June 2023, departing Newcastle at 8:00 AM. Senator Cadell stayed in Darwin for two nights, hired a self-drive hire car for two days and claimed travel expenses for fuel while in Darwin. On 30 June 2023, Senator Cadell travelled from Darwin to Sydney, departing Dawin at 1:20 PM, where he used Cabcharge for travel from the airport and stayed one night.
- 36. In his response of 6 February 2024, Senator Cadell advised that the purpose of his initial travel arrangements to Darwin was to attend public hearings for the Senate Environment and Communications Committee and the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral matters. In addition, Senator Cadell advised that he also arranged to meet with local tourism and hospitality stakeholders while in Darwin. When the public hearings for the Environment and Communications Committee were cancelled, Senator Cadell altered his travel arrangements to be in Darwin for the Joint Standing Committee on Electoral matters hearings and to meet with stakeholders.
- 37. Having considered the available information, including the response and additional documents provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied the dominant purpose of his travel to Darwin was parliamentary business and the use of parliamentary business resources was consistent with the legislative framework.

#### Senator Ross Cadell – staff travel expenses

- 38. One of Senator Cadell's MOP(S) Act staff travelled from Newcastle to Melbourne on 23 April 2023, departing Newcastle at 2:40 PM and stayed in Melbourne for one night. The MOP(S) Act staff returned to Newcastle on 24 April 2023, departing Melbourne at 12:30 PM. The MOP(S) Act staff use Cabcharge for transport to and from Newcastle and Melbourne airports.
- 39. The second of Senator Cadell's MOP(S) Act staff travelled from Newcastle to Brisbane on 8 May 2023, departing Newcastle at 7:50 AM with a return flight to Newcastle the same day, departing Brisbane at 2:20 PM.
- 40. For both MOP(S) Act staff, Senator Cadell was asked to confirm the travel undertaken was directed by the Senator or an authorised person in his office. Senator Cadell was also asked to confirm that official business which required his MOP(S) Act staff to travel to Melbourne and Brisbane.
- 41. In his response of 6 February 2024, Senator Cadell confirmed that the travel undertaken to Melbourne by the MOP(S) Act staff was directed by him. Senator Cadell confirmed he was to travel to Melbourne to attend an Environment and Communications References Committee hearing. The Committee hearing was cancelled, and Senator Cadell cancelled his travel arrangements. The MOP(S) Act staff reorganised meetings relating to research for the hearing and represented Senator Cadell at those meetings prior to returning to Newcastle.
- 42. Having considered the available information, including the response provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied the MOP(S) Act staff travel to Melbourne was directed by the Senator and was for the purpose of official duties.

- 43. Senator Cadell confirmed the travel undertaken to Brisbane by the MOP(S) Act staff was directed by him. Senator Cadell advised the MOP(S) Act staff travelled to Brisbane at his request to undertake stakeholder engagement and a site visit to a waste facility operation to prepare a report relating to the recycling modernisation fund for the Environment and Communications Committee.
- 44. Having considered the available information, including the response provided by Senator Cadell, IPEA is satisfied the MOP(S) Act staff unaccompanied travel to Brisbane was directed by Senator Cadell and was for the purpose of official duties.

#### Conclusion

45. IPEA has concluded that parliamentary business was the dominant purpose for all travel undertaken by Senator Cadell during the period in scope. IPEA has also concluded that the unaccompanied staff travel was directed by Senator Cadell for the purpose of official duties. No further action is required for this Assurance Review.

#### Assurance Review of travel and travel-related expenses

The Independent Parliamentary Expenses Authority (IPEA) has responsibility under the *Independent Parliamentary Expenses Authority Act 2017* to review work expenses accessed by parliamentarians and travel resources accessed by staff employed under the *Members of Parliament (Staff) Act 1984* (MOP(S) Act).

IPEA's assurance activities include reviewing the use of work expenses for travel to desirable destinations, family reunion travel, travel adjacent to public or school holidays and unaccompanied staff travel.

IPEA is undertaking an Assurance Review of travel and travel-related expenses incurred by you and two of your staff during the period 1 April to 30 June 2023. Please note IPEA publishes completed Assurance Reviews on the website <a href="https://www.ipea.gov.au">www.ipea.gov.au</a>.

#### Senator Ross Cadell - travel and travel-related expenses

Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Parliamentary Business Resources Act 2017* (PBR Act) sets out the principles parliamentarians are to apply when utilising public resources.

As you would be aware, under the principles-based scheme parliamentarians have an obligation to be prepared to publicly justify their use of public resources for conducting their parliamentary business (subsection 25(3) of the PBR Act). Parliamentarians also have an obligation to ensure that expenses that are incurred, or allowances or other public resources that are claimed, in relation to the conduct of the member's parliamentary business provide value for money, taking into account the need to conduct the member's parliamentary business (section 27 of the PBR Act).

'Parliamentary business' has the meaning given by section 6 of the PBR Act. Activities that fall within the four duty streams of parliamentary business are set out in the *Parliamentary Business Resources* (Parliamentary Business) Determination 2017 (the Determination – Attachment A).

Section 6 of the PBR Act also states:

However, an activity is not the parliamentary business of a member if:

- (a) the member carries it out for the dominant purpose of either or both of the following:
  - (i) providing a personal benefit to the member or another person;
  - (ii) pursuing commercial purposes of the member or another person; or
- (b) the activity is determined under subsection (3) for the purposes of this paragraph.

Attachment B contains details of your Commonwealth-funded travel within Australia in the relevant period and questions for your response to assist with the Assurance review. Where we have asked about the nature of your parliamentary business, please refer to the Determination and consider the examples outlined and provide copies of documentation to support your response, such as diary notes, invitations, or media reporting.

IPEA notes your travel to Tamworth to attend the NSW Nationals State Conference falls within the period in scope of this Assurance Review. Having reviewed the available information, IPEA is satisfied this travel was for the dominant purpose of parliamentary business and was in accordance with the legislative framework.

#### Senator Ross Cadell - staff travel expenses

Determination 2023/010 – Staff Travel and Relief Staff Arrangements (Previously Determination 2020/015) provides that electorate employees may travel as directed anywhere within Australia on official business. However, item 8 of the Determination states that travel may not be undertaken at Commonwealth expense for the personal benefit of an employee.

#### 5 Parliamentary business of members

- (1) For the purposes of paragraph 6(4)(a) of the Act, the *parliamentary duties* of a member are the activities specified in Schedule 1 for that member.
- (2) For the purposes of paragraph 6(4)(b) of the Act, the *electorate duties* of a member are the activities specified in Schedule 2 for that member.
- (3) For the purposes of paragraph 6(4)(c) of the Act, the *party political duties* of a member are the activities specified in Schedule 3 for that member.
- (4) For the purposes of paragraph 6(4)(d) of the Act, the *official duties* of a member are the activities specified in Schedule 4 for that member.





#### Senator Ross Cadell - travel and travel-related expenses

Division 2 of Part 3 of the *Parliamentary Business Resources Act 2017* (PBR Act) sets out the principles parliamentarians are to apply when utilising public resources.

As you would be aware, under the principles-based scheme parliamentarians have an obligation to be prepared to publicly justify their use of public resources for conducting their parliamentary business (subsection 25(3) of the PBR Act). Parliamentarians also have an obligation to ensure that expenses that are incurred, or allowances or other public resources that are claimed, in relation to the conduct of the member's parliamentary business provide value for money, taking into account the need to conduct the member's parliamentary business (section 27 of the PBR Act).

'Parliamentary business' has the meaning given by section 6 of the PBR Act. Activities that fall within the four duty streams of parliamentary business are set out in the *Parliamentary Business Resources* (Parliamentary Business) Determination 2017 (the Determination – Attachment A).

Section 6 of the PBR Act also states:

However, an activity is not the parliamentary business of a member if:

- (a) the member carries it out for the dominant purpose of either or both of the following:
  - (i) providing a personal benefit to the member or another person;
  - (ii) pursuing commercial purposes of the member or another person; or
- (b) the activity is determined under subsection (3) for the purposes of this paragraph.

Attachment B contains details of your Commonwealth-funded travel within Australia in the relevant period and questions for your response to assist with the Assurance review. Where we have asked about the nature of your parliamentary business, please refer to the Determination and consider the examples outlined and provide copies of documentation to support your response, such as diary notes, invitations, or media reporting.

Determination 2023/010 – Staff Travel and Relief Staff Arrangements (Previously Determination 2020/015) provides that electorate employees may travel as directed anywhere within Australia on official business. However, item 8 of the Determination states that travel may not be undertaken at Commonwealth expense for the personal benefit of an employee.
